HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

Early Intervention services are paid for by your health insurance and the Department of Public Health.

IS MY CHILD ELIGIBLE?

Early Intervention provides services for families with children from birth to three years old who:

Are not meeting developmental milestones

or

Have a qualifying medical diagnosis that impacts development

or

Face risks such as prematurity, low birth weight, or feeding difficulties

or

Have a parent with a disability, chronic illness or exposure to alcohol or narcotic substances



REFERRAL PROCESS

Anyone concerned about a child — including family members, pediatricians and community agencies — can call us to schedule a developmental evaluation.
